## Revolutionary Irrigation Technology Promises to Change Lives – Attend the Demo Hosted by aQysta and USAID at Georgetown Waterfront Park

WHAT:

aQysta, a Netherlands-based water and sustainability start-up, has recently entered into a partnership with United States Agency for International Development (USAID) Nepal. Engineers from aQysta will demonstrate their Barsha pump product – a hydro-powered pump that optimizes irrigation practices without emitting any harmful pollutants, to educate US stakeholders on this new technology and its impact on agricultural-dependent regions such as Nepal. Following the demonstration, USAID Nepal Mission Director, Beth Dunford, and aQysta chief executives Lennart Budelmann, Fred Henry, and Pratap Thapa, will host a Q&A session for invited media, and corporate and private investors.
